AN EXPERIMENTAL STUDY ON ENHANCING VOCABULARY THROUGH NEWSPAPER READING – PRINT Vs DIGITAL MEDIA: WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO FIRST YEAR COLLEGIATE STUDENTS

ABSTRACT

Language is the means of communication. Reading is one of the best skills to enhance everyone's language skill. The aim of the study is to explore the role of newspaper in developing the vocabulary of collegiate students and to analyze the importance of print and digital media. The author compares the effect of print and digital media among the collegiate students. An experimental study has been carried out among the first year college students of Sathyabama Institute of Science and Technology. Sixty preparatory students took part in the study. The overall studies examine the impact of print and digital media in developing vocabulary among first year collegiate students, and the result is found remarkable since the students are marvelous and interesting towards the usage of technology.

Introduction

Vocabulary is the key component of language requirements and reading activity increases the vocabulary of the students. Developing vocabulary is a crucial component of learning a language. Hence, reading newspapers as a habit definitely develops the vocabulary of readers. It entertains students and encourages the reading of English both indoor and outdoor. No doubt, the continuous reading of newspaper helps the students to gain higher level of language proficiency. The paper discusses on print media and digital media and compares their role in developing vocabulary.

Literature review

"Newspaper papers are affordable, available, and written in their final drafts, with minimal errors and which make them worthwhile language learning resource", according to Amina Gogo Tafida and Bala Muhammad Dalhat (August 2014). Bickel.J.M commented that "Electronic books may be able to provide educators and students new option, scaffolds and resource for reading material at all levels and for all purpose". Dayton,k. (2016) justifies that "Electronic media are faster, cheaper, wider reaching and appeal to more people as being current and cutting edge technology". Mercy Gnana Gandhi.S (2019), comments that the skills of the students especially the low proficient students will develop if the modern gadgets with online tools are effectively used in language classrooms. Mittal,D.R (2014) states that "Newspapers are really effective tool of



teaching; students should be given proper training of using newspaper that they can avail the best information, knowledge, wisdom and skill of English language". Xiao,L.X. (2005) comments that "Teachers ought to rely more often on informed assessment of learners' need and preferences than on unaided intuitions when making course planning decisions". Eisa Amiri and Lamerd Branch (June 2012) told that "Technological devices should always be used by students and teachers to provide an interaction between language learners and teacher since they are of the most popular and useful ways in language and literature learning". Vjosa Vela and Jeta Rushidi (April 2016) suggested that "Incorporating a vocabulary notebook into syllabus right from the start of the semester, would give students the chance to develop a useful vocabulary learning habit". Rohmatillah (2016) said that "By using newspaper, the students can be more enthusiastic, active, and creative and can be even an independent learner in learning vocabulary". Thus, it is clear from the earlier studies that reading English newspapers help learners improve their vocabulary and reading skill.

Reading test- Print media

During the study, students were tested in the classroom by using printed Hindu newspaper article. For this, sixty, first year students were selected and they were provided with passage from the news paper. To test their vocabulary, multiple choice questions were given. The students were asked to read the passage and to answer the questions. Later, their performances were recorded. The passages were selected carefully and special care was taken to see the interest among the students' community.




Fig:1 Overall Performance by students using Print and Digital media

Data collection


